

North-South Corridor Darlington Upgrade Project

**Major bridge installation
Main South Road and Southern Expressway weekend closure
8pm Friday 24 August – 6am Monday 27 August 2018**

As part of the Darlington Upgrade Project, eight bridges are being constructed to improve connectivity and traffic flow in the area.

Two of these bridges will be located on Main South Road over the Southern Expressway and will carry northbound traffic from Main South Road to the new lowered motorway and surface road.

The first of the two bridges was installed in late 2017, with the second due for installation in August 2018.

This fact sheet provides details of the weekend closure required for the installation of the second bridge.

Bridge Installation

The second bridge to be installed on Main South Road over the Southern Expressway is currently being constructed offline on the section of land between Main South Road, Marion Road and the Southern Expressway (near Hungry Jacks) and will then be transported and lifted into place.

The assembled bridge, weighing up to 3,000 tonnes, will be transported and manoeuvred into its final position using self-propelled modular transporters.

This installation method has been adopted rather than traditional bridge construction practices as it significantly reduces traffic and community impacts.

By utilising the offline method of construction, only one major weekend closure is required, alleviating the need for multiple major road closures.

Weekend Closure

In order to safely install the bridge, a weekend closure is required.

The closure will take place from 8pm on Friday 24 August – 6am on Monday 27 August 2018 on the section of Main South Road between Flinders Drive and Flagstaff Road; and the Southern Expressway between the Marion off ramp and the intersection of Main South Road.

During the weekend closure, detours for Main South Road traffic will be in place via Sturt Road and Marion Road.

The Southern Expressway will be operational, with traffic required to enter and exit at the Marion Road ramps.

Business as usual for Main South Road traders

Businesses within the closed section of Main South Road will continue to trade during the weekend closures. Please continue to support our local businesses during this time.

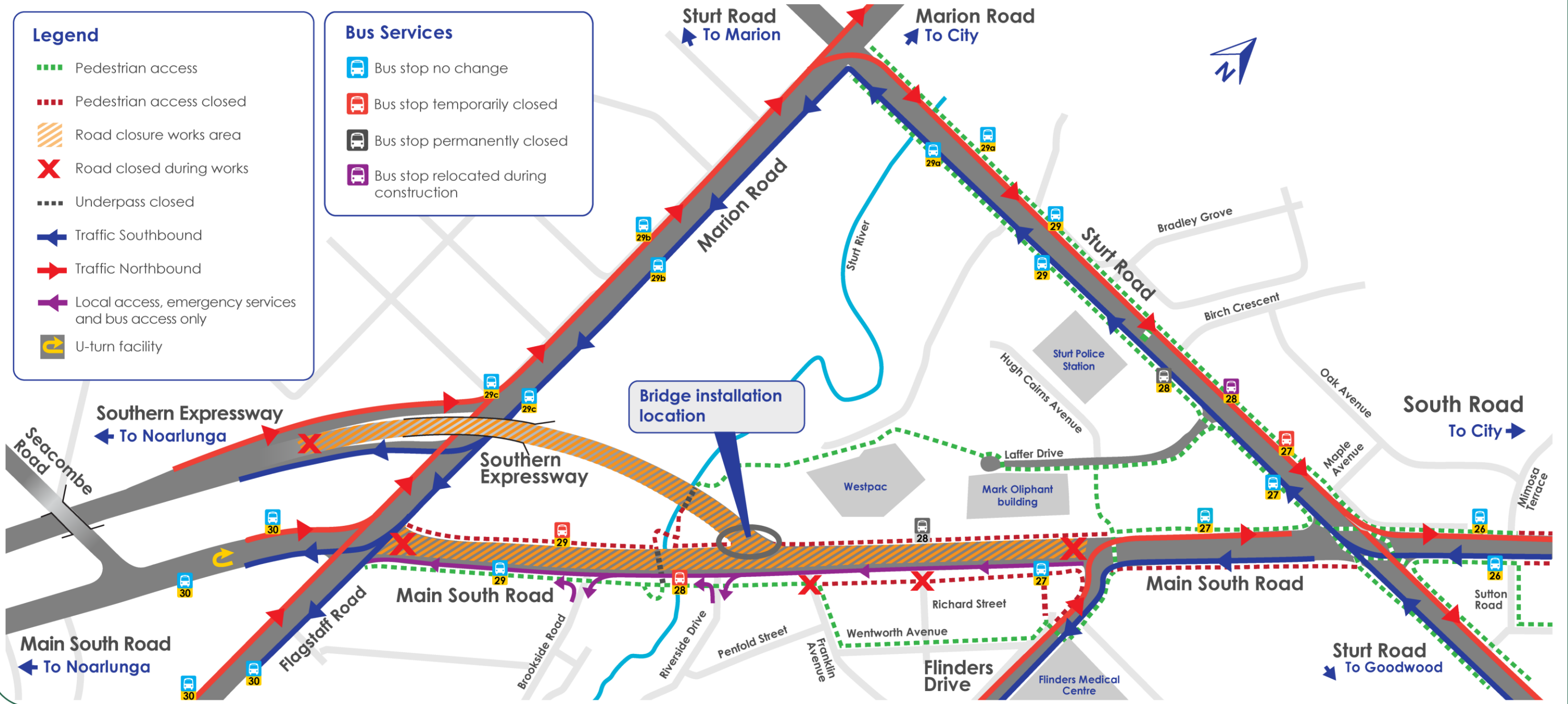

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Emergency and hospital access

Access for emergency services vehicles will be maintained at all times during the closure period.

This will be via a dedicated lane on the southbound carriageway of Main South Road, as shown in purple on the enclosed plan. On-site traffic controllers will be in place to direct vehicles as required.

Access to Flinders Drive will remain available at all times throughout the weekend. Motorists approaching from the south will be required to follow the detour route along Marion Road and Sturt Road.

Local resident and business access

Access for residents and businesses will be maintained at all times throughout the weekend via a dedicated lane. This lane will be available between Flinders Drive and Flagstaff Road for travel in a southbound direction only.

Motorists will be able to turn left in and out of Riverside Drive and Brookside Road. Franklin Avenue will be temporarily closed at Main South Road over the weekend for safety reasons. Richard Street will also remain closed.

Bedford Park South motorists wishing to travel northbound will be required to turn left onto Main South Road, complete a U-turn between Marion Road and Seacombe Road and then follow the detour via Marion Road and Sturt Road.

PLEASE NOTE: The right turn into Riverside Drive will be removed on the weekend of the bridge installation to allow for major drainage works. The left turn in and out will remain. A right turn into Franklin Avenue will come into effect at 6am on Monday 27 August.

Pedestrians and cyclists

Pedestrian access will continue to be available along the eastern side of Main South Road within the closed section. The Sturt River pedestrian underpass at Main South Road and the Southern Expressway will be closed.

Cyclists will be detoured via Sturt Road and Marion Road, as per the detour for motorists. Security personnel will be in place throughout the closure to assist with pedestrian movements and ensure that pedestrians do not enter the work zone.

Bus users

Flinders Drive bus stops will continue to be serviced during the weekend closures. Northbound buses servicing these stops will be detoured via Marion Road and Sturt Road so patrons should allow additional time.

Bus stop 27 and 29 (southbound) will continue to be serviced during the closures, via the single lane available along Main South Road.

Bus stop 29 (northbound) on Main South Road will be temporarily closed during the weekend closures. All buses that would normally service this stop will be detoured via Marion Road and Sturt Road. Patrons will be required to use bus stop 30 (northbound) on Main South Road or Flagstaff Road.
